First Tranche of U.S. Pfizer-BioNTech Vaccines Delivered to the Philippines

MANILA — The United States welcomes the successful May 10 arrival to the Philippines of 193,050 doses of the U.S. Pfizer-BioN-Tech COVID-19 vaccine, one of the safest and most effective vaccines in the world.

This delivery is the first tranche of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines and follows the arrival of 2,030,400 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine on May 8, bringing total COVAX deliveries to the Philippines to 2,673,000 doses. The U.S. is by far the largest contributor to the COVAX effort, funding one in five vaccinations in the Philippines provided by the facility.

U.S. Embassy Economic Counselor Chip Gamble joined Secretary of Science and Technology Fortunato de la Peña, Cabinet Secretary Karlo Nograles, and National Action Plan Against COVID-19 Deputy Chief Implementer Vince Dizon from the Philippine government, and other stakeholders at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport to welcome the first arrival of Pfizer-BioNTech on Monday night.

"As the largest contributor to COVAX, the United States welcomes the arrival of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine here in the Philippines. I am proud that this extraordinarily safe and effective vaccine, developed through U.S.

scientific ingenuity, will protect Filipinos. As we fight the pandemic together, the United States will continue to support the Philippines' vaccination and COVID-19 mitigation efforts," said U.S. Embassy Chargé d'Affaires John Law.

New international expert panel to address the emergence and spread of zoonotic diseases

International organizations have come together to launch a new One Health High-Level Expert Panel to improve understanding of how diseases with the potential to trigger pandemics, emerge and spread.

The panel will advise four international organizations - the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO); the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE); the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP); and the World Health Organization (WHO) - on the development of a long-term global plan of action to avert outbreaks of diseases like H5N1 avian influenza; MERS; Ebola; Zika, and, possibly, CO-

VID-19. Three quarters of all emerging infectious diseases originate in animals. It will operate under the One Health Approach, which recognizes the links between the health of people, animals, and the environment and highlights the need for specialists in multiple sectors to address any health threats and prevent disruption to agri-food systems.

Key first steps will include systematic analyses of scientific knowledge about the factors that lead to transmission of a disease from animal to human and vice versa; development of risk assessment and surveillance frameworks; identification of capacity gaps as well as agreement on good practices to prevent

and prepare for zoonotic outbreaks.

The panel will consider the impact of human activity on the environment and wildlife habitats. Critical areas will include food production and distribution; urbanization and infrastructure development; international travel and trade; activities that lead to biodiversity loss and climate change; and those that put increased pressure on the natural resource base - all of which can lead to the emergence of zoonotic diseases.

The panel will guide development of a dynamic new research agenda and draw up evidence-based recommendations for global, regional, national and local action. - WHO

Paxton sues Austin Eco Bilingual School founder accused of labor trafficking

Attorney General Ken Paxton has sued Austin Eco Bilingual School, a Spanish immersion preschool, accusing founder Adriana Rodriguez of labor trafficking. The victims found themselves in a dangerously mismanaged daycare that showed total disregard for immigration, labor, and child licensing laws. The foreign-born employees were lured to Texas with promises of lawful status, a decent salary and a rewarding career, but were instead victimized by an unscrupulous employer who trafficked them for their labor.

Rodriguez, who was once named the Greater Austin Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Businesswoman of the Year, sabotaged and controlled her employees' ability to work legally in the U.S.

Canadian sentenced for human smuggling conspiracy

A Canadian national was sentenced to 32 months in prison for conspiracy to bring undocumented immigrants to the United States for private financial gain in connection with his role in a scheme to smuggle undocumented immigrants from Sri Lanka through the Caribbean and into the United States.

Sri Kajamukam Chelliah, aka Mohan, aka Richie, 55, of Sri Lanka, pleaded guilty on Feb. 24, to conspiracy to bring aliens to the United States for private financial gain. Chelliah admitted to conspiring with others to facilitate the travel of undocumented immigrants from Sri Lanka through Haiti, Turks and Caicos Islands, and the Bahamas to the United States from on or about July 1, 2019, through on or about Oct. 10, 2019.

Six indicted for recruiting unqualified linguists for deployment with US Armed Forces in Afghanistan

A federal grand jury in the Eastern District of Virginia returned an indictment Wednesday charging six former employees of a government contractor for their role in a conspiracy to commit wire fraud in connection with a U.S. government contract to recruit and deploy qualified linguists to Afghanistan where they would provide language services in Dari and Pashto to the U.S. military, including interacting with Afghan civilians and military forces.

According to court documents, Mezghan N. Anwari, 41, of Centerville, Virginia, Abdul Q. Latifi, 45, of Irvine, California, Mahjoba Raofi, 47, of San Diego, California, Laila Anwari, 54, of Fredericksburg, Virginia, Rafi M. Anwari, 54, of Centerville, Virginia, and Zarghona Alizai, 48, of Annandale, Virginia, were employed as linguist recruiters for the Arlington, Virginia-based government contractor, which performed subcontract services such as recruiting linguists to serve in support of U.S. military operations, pursuant to a U.S. government prime contract valued in excess of \$700 million.

"HELP ME FIND MY BIOLOGICAL PARENTS"

AWEE ABAYARI



AWEE ABAYARI: Eric, how are you? Tell us your story.

ERIC SELFORS: Well, I am twenty three years old, I have a daughter and a wife and we live in Norway and I am working as a carpenter now.

AWEE ABAYARI: You previously mentioned to me that your biological parents are from the Philippines.

ERIC SELFORS: Yes, they are from Iloilo. My mother is Merlie Pineda and Alfredo Caro Loriega. They went to Manila to get jobs. I was born in Manila (Manila Memorial Hospital) and then brought to Hospicio de San Jose when I was two days old because my mom could not support me. I think I have another brother. At the Hospicio de San

Jose, I stayed about six months. Then I was adopted by a Norwegian couple and was brought to Norway by a social worker.

AWEE ABAYARI: Where did you get this information?

ERIC SELFORS: I have information that she left me before she gave me away. I got this from the Orphanage. My mother and father in Norway has been in contact with them for several years.

AWEE ABAYARI: What information did you get from your Norwegian parents about your biological

ERIC SELFORS: I got the names and when they got married and where they are from?

AWEE ABAYARI: When did your biological parents get married? You know, through the information given to you that you have an older brother? What is his name?

ERIC SELFORS: July 30, 1976, in Iloilo City. They did not write the name of my older brother in the

papers. He was also given for adoption, I understand.

AWEE ABAYARI: What else did they tell you about your parents?

ERIC SELFORS: They maybe in Manila. My father abandoned my mother when he went to Manila to get a job. So, my mother went alone to Manila, that was before I was born.

AWEE ABAYARI: How old were you when you started asking questions about your biological parents?

ERIC SELFORS: Maybe, four or five. My Norwegian parents were very good at telling me all I wanted to know, from the very beginning.

AWEE ABAYARI: Tell us about your parents in Norway. Do you have brothers and sisters?

ERIC SELFORS: They are both teachers and they are very good people. I have one older sister.

AWEE ABAYARI: I understand you went home to the Philippines recently?

ERIC SELFORS: I only stayed one week, we did not have enough time, we visited the Hospicio and did a lot of shopping. That was my second time to visit. Up to now, I do not have information about my parents.

AWEE ABAYARI: Why do you want to look for your parents now?

ERIC SELFORS: Because, I feel something is missing from my life and I really want to make a bond with them to thank them for the good life I've got and for thinking of my future.

AWEE ABAYARI: If you find your biological parents, what would be your immediate plan? Do you plan to go home? Would you also help them?

ERIC SELFORS: Yeah, we will go home immediately to the Philippines. I will help them, no problem.

AWEE ABAYARI: Tell us more about yourself now, Eric. Is there a big Filipino community in Norway?

eric selfors: Well, I am working as a carpenter. We have a big house and a good family. The Filipino community in Norway is not very big. I am not very sure how many Filipinos are here. It is very good to live in Norway, it is a good situation for the people to live here. I only speak English and Norwegian. I learnt English in school.

I am 172 cms in height, 80 kilos, brown complexion, with black hair. They say that I look like a Filipino.

AWEE ABAYARI: Tell us about your wife? Did she know about your past before you married her?

ERIC SELFORS: She is Norwegian. Yes, she knows about me being adopted. She is very excited about finding my biological parents. We just got married June this year. That is why we went to the Philippines for a week. She is Lisa. My baby's name is Mathea. My wife is blonde but my daughter looks like me.

AWEE ABAYARI: Tell us about Christmas in Norway. What do you like most about Norway?

ERIC SELFORS: A lot of snow and very cold. We have Christmas Lanterns and Christmas Tree and all the decorations. I like the people of Norway most of all.

AWEE ABAYARI: What is your final appeal?

ERIC SELFORS: To my biological parents, if you are listening now, please contact Radio Manila. Thank you very much.

AWEE ABAYARI: I wish and pray, Eric, that you will find your biological parents. For those who are listening to Radio Manila, and know the parents of Eric, please call us right now. This will be a most wonderful gift for Eric.

First Letter from Eric: FINDING MY FILIPINO PARENTS!!

Hello!

I pray to God that someone in Radio Manila can please help me ...

I am a 23 year old Filipino, who was given up for adoption by my Filipino parents 23 years ago. Adopted by my Norwegian parents to the country Norway in Europe. Now, I am trying to find my biological parents, who were last employed in Manila (Sampaloc). They were natives of Iloilo, but moved to Manila to get work. I also have an older brother or sister who may still live in Iloilo. Mother's maiden name is Merlie L. Pineda/Penida (not quite sure about the last name)

Father's birth name is Alfredo Caro Loriega. Is it possible for you to make a story about this?? To help me get in touch with them, or even just find out that they are ok. I don't even know if they are alive ... Please help me and my wife to find them, that is the only thing I wish for !!!! We just arrived from Manila, and we regret not contacting Radio Manila before we left.

I really hope, with all of my heart for a positive response from you !!!

Second letter from Eric PLEASE HELP ME FIND MY PARENTS!

I am a 23 year old Filipino, with wife and a daughter in Norway. In May 1985, I was given for adoption to Norway by my biological parents in the Philippines. I now live in Norway and have a good life here. If there are anyone that recognize the names Merlie Lazapin Penida/Pineda or Alfredo Caro Loriega, please find it in your hearts to help us find them. My mother and father are natives of lloilo, and in 1984 they ,moved to Manila to get a job. My father, Alfredo, probably abandoned my mother when she was conceiving her second child (myself). They are both about 56 years old now and the last clue of my mother was an address in Manila where she worked as a house maid.

The address is: 1272 Carola St., Sampaloc, Manila but this is 23 years ago. I was born 20th of October 1984 in a hospital called Memorial Hospital in Manila, and then the 22nd October 1984 given to Hospicio de San Jose, the orphanage where I spent my first four months. My birth name was Arnold Pineda/Penida Loriega but I got a Norwegian name when I came to Norway. I also have an older sibling in the Philippines, that person is older than me and is probably adopted to lloilo (Visayas). My parents got married 30th July 1976, also in Iloilo. I pray to God that someone can help us to find my parents and sibling because they are a big part of my heart and I wonder everyday what they look like and how they are doing. I am very grateful for my Filipino parents and hope that both of them and my sibling are doing good. If there is anyone out there, please contact Radio Manila. NASA readies its best asteroid punch

It sounds like the plot of a Hollywood blockbuster, but it's real. NASA scientists will soon launch a mission to change the course of a distant asteroid in a test of technology that could one day save planet Earth from disaster.

The Double Asteroid Redirection Test (DART) spaceship could launch as early as July. It will travel 11 million kilometers and slam into the smaller part of the Didymos binary asteroid system, knocking the moonlet slightly off its current path. The asteroid punch is planned for September 2022.

Shortly before impact, a shoebox-sized satellite built by NASA partners in Italy will break away from the rocket to help scientists study the asteroid's trajectory after the collision and determine if the mission is a success.

"Up until now, we haven't had too many options for what we might do if we found something that was incoming," Andy Rivkin, a member of the DART investigation team said. "DART is the first test of how we might be able to deflect something without having to resort to a nuclear package, or sitting in our basements, waiting it out, and crossing our fingers."

Didymos does not threaten Earth, but the DART mission will prepare NASA for an asteroid that might. About once a year, a car-sized asteroid slams into Earth's atmosphere but burns up before reaching the planet's surface. Larger impacts, causing significant damage, might occur once every 2,000 years, NASA says, while an object that might actually threaten civilization comes along only once every few million years.

DART's punch is expected to change the course of the Didymos moonlet, also called Didymos B, by only a fraction

of 1 percent. Scientists have been working for years to figure out how they will measure that change and other effects on Didymos B. Imaging technology on board DART; the Italian Space Agency's small satellite, Light Italian Cubesat for Imaging of Asteroids (LICIACube); and telescopic observations from Earth all will help NASA observe the mission.

Thai Science Park to focus on bio-circular economy

Thailand Science Park, a flagship research and development hub in the Kingdom, will refocus its priorities on projects that advance a bio-, circular and green economy, a move that is in line with the national agenda.

"Thailand Science Park (TSP) is making four clusters its main priorities: agriculture, food, health and digital. These key sectors are imperative for the country's competitiveness," said Suwipa Wanasathop, Vice President of the National Science and Technology Development Agency (NSTDA) and Director of TSP.

Thailand has adopted a 20-year National Strategy named Thailand 4.0. designed to propel the Kingdom to a higher level of development, it supports research and development, innovation, creativity, advanced technologies and



adopting principles and practices of the circular economy, with an emphasis on green industries and bio-industries.

TSP administrators believe that by aligning with the national strategy, they can create more synergy to achieve the country's goals.

Thailand Science Park is located in the province of Pathum Thani, just north of Bangkok. The park is home to 110 firms and five national research centers, with more than 2,000 researchers employed there.

Spanish Navy Training Ship on Goodwill Port Call in Cebu

U.S. AIR FORCE SOUTHERN TO LEAD U.S. SOUTHERN COMMAND'S UPCOMING EXERCISE IN GUATEMALA


The United States 12th Air Force (Air Force Southern, or AFSOUTH) will be leading U.S. Southern Command's upcoming exercise in Guatemala - this exercise will provide joint training and improve readiness of U.S. and Guatemalan civil engineers, medical professionals and support personnel in humanitarian assistance techniques from May until August

As part of the exercise, U.S. military engineers will also work side-by-side with Guatemalan military forces to renovate a training site at a Guatemalan military base in Poptún, Peten.

Additionally, U.S. military doctors, dentists, and veterinarians will work with local partners in Melchor de Mencos. A primary care team will provide basic medical services and education, a dental team will perform extractions and cleanings in rural communities, and a veterinary team will offer large animal care education and vaccinations at various locations during the exercise. The exercise will improve U.S. and Guatemalan abilities to rapidly respond to crises together.

DUTERTE: BENHAM RISE IS EXCLUSIVELY PHILIPPINE PROPERTY

MANILA-- President Rodrigo Roa Duterte recently said the Benham Rise is exclusively Philippine property, stressing he would not allow other nations to intrude in the area except for innocent passage of foreign vessels.

Benham Rise became a topic for discussion after former Senate President Juan Ponce Enrile suggested that the Philippine government exploit the area using resources from economic dealing with China.

"I have made it clear to all, to the world, that I will not allow any intrusion there. Well, of course, the right to innocent passage is everybody's privilege," President Duterte said during his weekly public address.

"But to allow anybody, even to just try to exploit or to even to look in,

you know, I will not allow them to do that because that belongs --- Philippine Rise belongs to the Filipino people."

Enrile, who was a guest during the President's Talk to the People, suggested that whatever the country can get from China on the West Philippine Sea, it must be used to strengthen the Philippine military capability and to exploit Benham Rise.

Benham Rise is a 13 million hectare under sea region east of Luzon and is 35 meters underwater at its shallowest point off the provinces of Aurora and Isabela. In April 2012, the United Nation (UN) officially approved and recognized the claim of the Philippines in strict compliance with the requirements of the United Nations Convention on the law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

Wider than the entire Luzon,
Samar, and Leyte combined, it became
official part of the Philippines because
it is the only country within 200 nautical
miles of the plateau. UN's recognition enables the Philippines to extract
abundant mineral, oil and natural gas of
Benham Rise, believed to have mineral
and gas deposits, providing the country
with its own energy source. (PND)

U.S. Filipino leaders thank Biden for donated vaccines at the White House rally, appeal for more

WASHINGTON, DC -- Filipino
American leaders rallied recently in front
of the White House to thank President
Biden and the American People for delivering an initial donation of 2.5 million
doses of AstraZeneca vaccines through
the COVAX facility to the Philippines.

The dozen leaders also appealed to Biden to release by Memorial Day an additional 5 million doses from the excess AstraZeneca stockpile in Baltimore and in Ohio. Biden recently pledged to donate 60 million doses not being used in America to help desperate nations. They also sang the US National Anthem and the Pilipino song, Bayan Ko.

The community leaders are planning another White House rally in June with other community organizations to thank the Biden Administration after the next tranche of millions of donated vaccines arrive. During the next weeks their supporters in several states will virtually meet with the staff of US Senators and Biden administration officials to advocate for the early delivery of donated AZ vaccines.

According to the US Embassy Manila website, the Filipino people can expect another separate 42 million doses from the American funded COVAX facility. Delivery dates are still unknown.





Like any vaccine, COVID-19 vaccines can cause side effects, most of which are mild or moderate and go away within a few days on their own. As shown in the results of clinical trials, more serious or long-lasting side effects are possible. Vaccines are continually monitored to detect adverse events.

ENCOURAGING HEALTHY EATING

The physical, mental, and emotional changes that occur as children transition from pre-school to school age and into adolescence come with diverse opportunities to support a healthy dietary pattern. It's important for parents, guardians, and caregivers of young children to know that it can take up to 10 exposures before children accept a new type of food.

Some strategies to increase food acceptance include:

- · Offering vegetables in different forms, such as cooked or raw
- Cutting fruits and vegetables into small, bite-sized pieces
- Pairing fruits or vegetables with a food the child enjoys, such as yogurt or peanut butter

Since children's dietary patterns often resemble those of their household, there are multiple strategies that health professionals can share to support families.

- Shared meals Early in childhood, shared meals have a tremendous impact on modeling healthy eating behaviors and dietary practices. Making nutrient-dense foods and beverages part of the normal household meal routine helps children observe and learn healthy behaviors that extend into adolescences and adulthood.
- Snacks Promoting nutrientdense foods for snacks, such as fruits and vegetables, can go a long way in shaping a child's diet. For example, carrot sticks and hummus or apple slices and peanut butter are better snack options than chips, crackers, or cookies.
- Meal decisions Parents and caregivers can involve and guide children in age-appropriate meal decisions, as well as involve them in food shopping and cooking. When children feel more empowered in their food choices, they start to learn how to independently make healthy choices.
- Beverage selection Decreasing consumption of sugarsweetened beverages will help children and adolescents reduce their intake of added sugars and achieve a healthy dietary pattern. Beverages that contain no added sugars should be the primary choice. These include water and unsweetened fat-free or low-fat milk (including low-lactose or lactose-free options and fortified soy beverages). Fruit juice with no added sugars is also an option. - health.gov

vaccines have mostly been mild to moderate and have lasted no longer than a few days. Typical side effects include pain at the injection site, fever, fatigue, headache, muscle pain, chills and diarrhoea. The chances of any of these side effects occurring after vaccination differ according to the specific vaccine.

COVID-19 vaccines protect against the SARS-CoV-2 virus only, so it's still important to keep yourself healthy and

LONG-TERM SIDE EFFECTS

Side effects usually occur within the first few days of getting a vaccine. Since the first mass vaccination programme started in early December 2020, hundreds of millions of vaccine doses have been administered.

There have been concerns about

COVID-19 vaccines making people sick with COVID-19. But none of the approved vaccines contain the live virus that causes COVID-19, which means that COVID-19 vaccines cannot make you sick with COVID-19.

After vaccination, it usually takes a few weeks for the body to build immunity against SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. So it's possible a person could be infected with SARS-CoV-2 just before or after vaccination and still get sick with COVID-19. This is because the vaccine has not yet had enough time to provide protection.

Experiencing side effects after getting vaccinated means the vaccine is working and your immune system is responding as it should. Vaccines are safe, and getting vaccinated will help protect you against COVID-19. - CDC

Domestic Travel Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People

If you are fully vaccinated, take the following steps to protect others when you travel:

Have You Been Fully Vaccinated?

People are considered fully vaccinated*:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

If you don't meet these requirements, you are NOT fully vaccinated.

Keep taking all precautions until you are fully vaccinated.

If you have a condition or are taking medication that weakens your immune system, you may NOT be fully protected even if you are fully vaccinated. Talk to your healthcare provider. Even after vaccination, you may need to continue taking all precautions.

- During Travel
- o Wearing a mask over your nose and mouth is required on planes, buses, trains, and other forms of public transportation traveling into, within, or out of the United States and in U.S. transportation hubs such as airports and

stations

- o Follow all state and local recommendations and requirements, including mask wearing and social distancing.
 - After Travel
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms; isolate and get tested if you develop symptoms.
- o Follow all state and local recommendations or requirements.

You do NOT need to get tested or self-quarantine if you are fully vaccinated or have recovered from COVID-19 in the past 3 months. You should still follow all other travel recommendations.

Domestic Travel Recommendations for Unvaccinated People

If you are not fully vaccinated and must travel, take the following steps to protect yourself and others from COVID-19:

- Before you travel:
- o Get tested with a viral test 1-3 days before your trip.
 - While you are traveling:
- o Wear a mask over your nose and mouth. Wearing a mask is required on planes, buses, trains, and other forms of public transportation traveling into, within, or out of the United States

and in U.S. transportation hubs such as airports and stations.

- o Avoid crowds and stay at least 6 feet/2 meters (about 2 arm lengths) from anyone who is not traveling with you.
- o Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer.
 - After you travel:
- o Get tested with a viral test 3-5 days after travel AND stay home and self-quarantine for a full 7 days after
- Even if you test negative, stay home and self-quarantine for the full 7 days.
- If your test is positive, isolate yourself to protect others from getting infected.
- o If you don't get tested, stay home and self-quarantine for 10 days after travel.
- o Avoid being around people who are at increased risk for severe illness for 14 days, whether you get tested or not.
- Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms; isolate and get tested if you develop symptoms.
- o Follow all state and local recommendations or requirements. Source: CDC

INTERNET FRAUD

Internet fraud is the use of Internet services or software with Internet access to defraud victims or to otherwise take advantage of them. Internet crime schemes steal millions of dollars each year from victims and continue to plague the Internet through various methods, which include the following:

- Business E-Mail Compromise (BEC): A sophisticated scam targeting businesses working with foreign suppliers and companies that regularly perform wire transfer payments. The scam is carried out by compromising legitimate business e-mail accounts through social engineering or computer intrusion techniques to conduct unauthorized transfers of funds.
- Data Breach: A leak or spill of data which is released from a secure location to an untrusted environment.

Data breaches can occur at the personal and corporate levels and involve sensitive, protected, or confidential information that is copied, transmitted, viewed, stolen, or used by an individual unauthorized to do so.

- Denial of Service: An interruption of an authorized user's access to any system or network, typically one caused with malicious intent.
- E-Mail Account Compromise (EAC): Similar to BEC, this scam targets the general public and professionals associated with, but not limited to, financial and lending institutions, real estate companies, and law firms. Perpetrators of EAC use compromised e-mails to request payments to fraudulent locations.
- Malware/Scareware: Malicious software that is intended to damage or disable computers and computer systems.

HANG UP ON AUTO WARRANTY ROBOCALLS

Have you gotten a recorded
phone message from "Susie" with
the "Vehicle Service Department"
calling about your vehicle warranty?
That's, like, so retro. But fanny packs,
scrunchies, and tie dye are back — and
so are vehicle warranty robocalls.

It starts when you pick up a call and hear a recorded message saying something about your vehicle's manufacturer's warranty. It might say that they've sent you several notices in the mail. They say you haven't extended your warranty past the factory cut off, and they're going to close your file soon if you don't respond. And, you should press a number if you're interested in renewing your warranty, or press a different number if you want to be removed from the list.

Slam on the brakes. This is an illegal robocall and likely a scam. The companies behind this type of robocall are not with your car dealer or manufacturer, and the "extended warranty" they're trying to sell you is actually a service contract that often sells for hundreds or thousands of dollars.

If you get one of these calls:

- Hang up. Don't engage with a company that reaches you with an illegal call.
- Consider using an app or device to block unwanted calls.

Gov. Newsom signs legislation to fast-track key housing, economic dev't projects in California

SAN JOSE – On May 20th, Governor Gavin Newsom signed legislation by Senate President pro Tempore Toni G. Atkins (D-San Diego) that extends expedited California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review for key



developments and expands the streamlining process to include small-scale housing projects – boosting the state's economic recovery with the creation of more housing and good jobs.

"California's recovery from the pandemic must tackle the housing shortage that threatens our economic growth and long-term prosperity," said Governor Newsom. "Cutting red tape to save time and remove barriers to production helps us meet the urgent need for more housing while creating good jobs and preserving important environmental review. I thank Pro Tem Atkins and the Legislature's leaders on housing for their partnership in taking on this challenge."

Governor Newsom signed SB 7 at the proposed site of Google's Downtown West project, a mixed-use development in San Jose that the Governor certified for expedited CEQA review in 2019. The project will create 4,000 units of housing, with 25 percent affordable, as well as retail and office space.
