DOE challenges America's innovators to propose improvements to the Bulk Power System to improve resilience

► EATTLE, WASHINGTON — Assistant Secretary for the Office of Electricity (OE), Bruce J. Walker, announced the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) "Electricity Industry Technology and Practices Innovation Challenge." This contest is designed to tap into American ingenuity for ideas on how to modify or replace existing processes and procedures, the use of technology, and traditional energy industry practices to improve grid operations, with the goal of making the nation's Bulk Power System stronger and more resilient

Under this Challenge, DOE's Office of Electricity will seek ideas from industry, academia, and other innovators. Potential innovations may include technologies or solutions that can eliminate or mitigate existing or emerging vulnerabilities, eliminate and thwart existing and emerging threats, and mitigate or eliminate energy sector interdependencies.

Proposed technologies and solutions should enhance the planning, construction, and/ or operations of the Bulk Power System. Solutions that incorporate fuel delivery infrastructure for generation (including hydropower) will also be considered, as long as those solutions have a direct and substantial effect on the reliability and resilience of the Bulk Power System.

This forthcoming Challenge builds on DOE's efforts with the private sector and academia to continue advancing the resilience and reliability of the nation's critical energy infrastructure. More details on the Challenge will be available in the near future. - Source: Dept. of Energy

US, PHL cut the ribbon on EDCA project

PAMPANGA, Philippines — U.S. Ambassador Sung Y. Kim and Secretary of National Sung Y. Kim and Secretary of N Sung Y. Kim and Secretary of National Defense Delfin N. Lorenzana cut the ribbon on the first major project under the Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement (EDCA) at Cesar Basa Air Base, Pampanga, on January 29.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony marked the completion of construction on a Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief warehouse,



which will be used to preposition equipment and supplies critical to the U.S. and Philippines' ability to respond quickly and effectively to humanitarian crises in the region

EDCA builds capacity for U.S. forces and the Armed Forces of the Philippines by enabling greater interoperability, capability development, and modernization.

The United States is working closely with the Philippine government on future EDCA projects at four other locations: Fort Magsaysay Military Reservation, Lumbia Air Base, Antonio Bautista Air Base, and Mactan Benito Ebuen Air Base.

CBP, FURA seize cocaine worth \$10 million inside abandoned vessel in northern Puerto Rico

AN JUAN, Puerto Rico — U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Border Patrol and Puerto Rico Police Department (PRPD) Joint Forces for Rapid Action (FURA) agents seized 884 pounds (401 kilos) of cocaine found inside an abandoned vessel on the coast of the town of Loiza. The estimated value of the seized narcotics is \$10 million

U.S. Coast Guard and CBP Air and Marine assets located a suspected smuggling vessel traveling south towards the northern coast of Puerto Rico. U.S. Border Patrol Agents responded to the area of Loiza where the vessel had made landfall. The abandoned vessel contained foreign food products indicating that the vessel had arrived from a foreign country.

After an extensive search, agents



discovered 12 bundles containing 350 bricks, which field-tested positive to the properties of cocaine. Border Patrol agents seized the vessel,

engine and contraband, handing it over to the custody of the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) for investigation

Two Ukrainian nationals indicted in computer hacking and securities fraud scheme

wo Ukrainian men have been charged for their roles in a large-scale, international conspiracy to hack into the Securities and Exchange Commission's (SEC) computer systems and profit by trading on critical information they stole. In a 16-count indictment unsealed recently in the District of New Jersey, Artem Radchenko, 27, and Oleksandr Ieremenko, 26, both of Kiev, Ukraine, are charged with securities fraud conspiracy, wire fraud conspiracy, computer fraud conspiracy, wire fraud, and computer fraud. The SEC also filed a civil complaint charging leremenko along with several other individuals and entities.

The indictment alleges that Radchenko and leremenko hacked into the SEC's Electronic Data Gathering, Analysis and Retrieval (EDGAR) system and stole thousands of files.

President Duterte orders AFP to destroy Abu Sayyaf Group

OLO, SULU — President Rodrigo Roa Duterte on January 28, ordered the Armed Forces of the Philippines to crush the Abu Sayyaf Group after visiting the site of fatal bombings in Jolo.

"I ordered you to destroy the organization. I'm ordering you now: *pulpugin ninyo ang Abu* Sayyaf by whatever means," the Commander-in-Chief strongly mandated the government's forces after the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS),

through their local counterpart Abu Sayyaf, claimed responsibility for the bombings.

"Ang gawin ninyo, sabihin ninyo paqkabobombahin moʻyang lahat...paalisin mo iyong mga tao. Paalisin moʻyung mga tao, ilagay mo dito kung saan ako...ako ang maggastos ng pagkain... lahat. Tapos plantsahin ninyo ng bala," he added.

"Our duty is to protect the Filipino people. And second is that we have to preserve the nation.

'Pag nawala iyang Jolo, maski isang island diyan, well, we have failed in our mission to preserve the territory of the Republic of the Philippines." he

The President expressed outrage over the terrorist attacks and said that despite the presence of rebellious groups such as the Moro National Liberation Front of Nur Misuari in Jolo, the Christians and Joloanos "continue to live here in peace together."

"Meron tayong mga rebelde kagaya nila Nur Misuari...Murad...pero ang rebolusyon ho nila is territorial," he said. Unlike the Abu Sayyaf, the group has "no ideology" and declared loyalty to the "evil movements" of ISIS.

Before his speech, President Duterte visited the bombed Catholic cathedral and inspected the area. There, he witnessed the massive destruction caused by the bombing attacks. He also met with the victims' next of kin at Camp Teodulfo Bautista Multipurpose Hall, where he provided the victims' families financial assistance and vowed to give justice to their loved ones.

The President also visited the wounded military personnel at the Camp Teodulfo Bautista Station Hospital. He provided the soldiers medical and financial assistance and awarded them the Order of Lapu-Lapu with Rank of Kampilan.

UN condemns terrorist attack on church in Southern Philippines

n a statement issued by a UN spokesperson, the Secretary-General expressed his sincere condolences to the families of the victims and wished a speedy recovery to the wounded.

According to media reports, twin bombings ripped through the Jolo Cathedral in the island province of Sulu, which is in the Philippines southern Bangsamoro region.

Rodrigo Roa Duterte ordered the Armed

The attack occurred during Sunday morning services and reportedly killed nearly 20 people and left more than 80 wounded.

"The Secretary-General calls for the perpetrators of these crimes to be swiftly brought to justice," the statement said, and added that Mr. Guterres reiterated the support of the United Nations to the Philippines Government and people in their efforts to fight terrorism and violent extremism, and to carry forward the peace process in Bangsamoro region.

In late July 2018 President Rodrigo Duterte signed new legislation — formally the Organic Law for Bangsamoro in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao – which granted extra autonomy to Muslim communities living in the Southern Philippines, raising hopes that years of separatist violence involving central Government troops and militants could be brought to an end.

The attack comes days after voters approved the creation of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in majority-Muslim areas of southern Philippines. But reports suggest that voters in Sulu province, where Jolo is located, rejected it. - Source: United Nations

COUPLE CONVICTED OF FORCING YOUNG, WEST AFRICAN GIRL TO LABOR IN THEIR HOME IN TEXAS FOR 16 YEARS

efendants Mohamed Toure and Denise Cros-Toure, of Southlake, Texas, were convicted late yesterday by a federal jury in Ft. Worth, Texas, of forced labor and other federal felonies for compelling the domestic labor of a young, undocumented West African girl for 16 years.

"The defendants preyed on a young and extremely vulnerable girl. Their despicable actions included cruelly abusing her, forcing her to work in their home, hidden in plain sight, for years without pay, and robbing her of her childhood," said Assistant Attorney General Eric Dreiband. "Human trafficking is a disgraceful and unacceptable crime, and this verdict should send the very clear message that the Justice Department will investigate and vigorously prosecute these cases to hold human traffickers accountable and bring justice to their victims."

"Our district is passionate about combatting forced labor. I'm gratified that we were able to obtain a measure of justice for this young woman, who suffered for years at the hands of this couple – people who assumed they could deprive a little girl of her rightful freedoms with impunity," said U.S. Attorney Nealy Cox.

"I'm especially grateful to the witnesses who helped rescue this woman and brought the defendants' crimes into the light of day. If we want to wipe out human trafficking, we need the whole community to support the effort and be alert.

"This verdict sends a strong message: Diplomatic Security is committed to making sure that those who exploit and traffic individuals, especially children, will face consequences for their criminal actions," said Jeffrey McGallicher, Special Agent in Charge of the DSS Houston Field

Following a four-day trial, the jury convicted the defendants of forced labor, conspiracy to commit alien harboring, and alien harboring.







ADB President, Philippine Foreign Affairs Secretary discuss partnership

ANILA, PHILIPPINES — Asian Development Bank (ADB) President Mr. Takehiko Nakao and the Philippines' Foreign Affairs Secretary Mr. Teodoro L. Locsin Jr. met recently to discuss stronger partnership on institutional matters.

Mr. Nakao expressed his deep appreciation to Mr. Locsin for the longstanding cooperation of the Department of Foreign Affairs in the implementation of the Headquarters Agreement between ADB and the Philippines signed in 1966.

"ADB is committed to further strengthening our relations with the Department of Foreign Affairs," Mr. Nakao said.

The Philippines is a founding member of ADB and has hosted ADB's headquarters since its establishment in 1966. The country has hosted 16 Annual Meetings of ADB's Board of Governors, including the successful 51st Annual Meeting in May 2018, with more than 4,000 participants.

ADB is a strong partner in the development of the Philippines and is one of the country's largest sources of sovereign and nonsovereign lending, grant, and technical assistance, extending nearly \$19 billion in assistance in areas including public sector management; energy; agriculture, natural resources, and rural development; and finance between 1969 and 2018.

In 2018, ADB lent \$1.38 billion to the Philippines for two policy-based loans on public-private partnerships in infrastructure and financial inclusion, Mindanao growth corridors roads project, and the emergency loans and grants to support recovery for Marawi. In 2019, ADB expects to roll out its biggest program of support exceeding \$2.5 billion with flagship projects including the Malolos—Clark railway project, EDSA Greenways project, Angat water transmission improvement project, the secondary education support project,

policy-based loans on local governance, youth employment and capital markets, and a capacity building project to foster competition.

The country operations business plan includes \$7.14 billion in lending for the three-year period of 2019 to 2021. With the Philippine economy recording economic growth of 6.2% for 2018, it continues its longest economic expansion in 50 years. ADB expects the economy to continue this expansion in the medium term with public and private investment and household consumption driving this growth. ADB has projected the Philippine economy to grow by 6.7% this year.

To aim higher, Afghanistan's central bank bet on upskilling employees

ABUL CITY — Everyday, Madina Rasouli processes employee salaries and handles pension-related documents at the central bank. The work is neither complex nor difficult for Rasouli after four years working at the Human Resources department at Da Afghanistan Bank (DAB).

Rasouli, however, has not been able to move on in her career or apply for better positions because of her lack of qualification. She has a two-year diploma in management and had been unable to go further in university because she could not afford it. "I was always looking for an opportunity to get my BBA [Bachelor of Business Administration] one day," says the 27-year-old.

The opportunity came when she was selected by DAB to pursue a BBA course at Kardan Private University under the Financial Sector Rapid

Response Project (FSRRP). "I am sure studying at university will equip me with better skills and enable me to apply for better positions at DAB," says Rasouli happily.

Rasouli is one of some 700 DAB employees who have been given the opportunity to study for a bachelor's or master's degree at university or pursue professional and technical courses under the DAB Talent Development Program started by FSRRP in February 2018. These employees will pursue professional courses related to their work, such as Certified Internal Audit, Certified Anti Money Laundering Specialist, Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, and Certified Expert in Financial Inclusion Policy.

FSRRP is implemented by DAB, with funding support from the International Development Association (IDA), the World Bank Group's fund for the poorest countries. It aims to help DAB develop a set of action plans to improve banking supervision and implement a modern payment system for efficient and transparent payment transactions.

ADB, Nauru, Australia partner to build efficient, climate-resilient port

A IWO, NAURU — The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the governments of Australia and Nauru participated in a groundbreaking ceremony last month to officially mark the first step toward the construction of the country's first international port.

Nauru President Mr. Baron Divavesi Waqa led the groundbreaking ceremony and gave a keynote speech. Australia's Assistant Minister for International Development and the Pacific Ms. Anne Ruston and ADB's Development Coordinator for Nauru Ms. Camilla Solomon participated in the event.

"We waited for more than a century to change our dream of having an international port into reality," said Mr. Waqa. "We are delighted to partner with ADB, the Green Climate Fund (GCF), and the Government of Australia in this initiative, and this event is symbolic of our long-term development partnership."

Financed by ADB, GCF, and the governments of Australia and Nauru, the Nauru Sustainable and Climate Resilient Connectivity Project will upgrade the largely unworkable boat harbor into an international port.

The new, climate-proofed Nauru Port will

allow large vessels to berth with the construction of a wharf featuring a berth pocket and breakwater. Port security will be established to ensure compliance with international best practices, while a container storage area will be built.

"The redevelopment of the port will be transformative for Nauru," said Ms. Ruston. "It will create jobs and spur economic growth through increased trade and investment, deepening Nauru's connectivity to the region and more widely. Australia is proud to be involved in this important project and looks forward to working with the Government of Nauru." - ADB

PHL Embassy holds consular outreach in Virginia Beach, joins anti-trafficking forum

ASHINGTON, D.C. – The consular team of the Philippine Embassy in Washington, D.C. conducted its first consular mission for 2019 in Virginia Beach, VA on 18-20 January

Virginia Beach is a city 4 hours drive from Washington D.C. with a population of more than 26,600 of Filipino origin, many of whom are professionals as well as serving or retired US Navy personnel.

On the night of January 18, the consular team attended an anti-human trafficking forum at the Sandler Center, which was followed by a musical and eco-fashion show featuring the creations of Filipino designer Joseph Aloysius Montelibano. A portion of the show's proceeds will benefit the local anti-trafficking NGOs Virginia Beach Justice Initiative (VBII) and Butterfly House

Consul General Renato Villa and Atty. Darlene Pajarito, a Prosecutor at the Philippine Department of Justice (DOJ), talked about civil society and the government's key roles to combat trafficking and providing aid and succor to victims.

Atty. Pajarito, a recipient of the Trafficking in Person Hero Award from the US State Department in 2011, is currently a Hubert H. Humphrey fellow at the American University in Washington, D.C.

The consular team rendered a total of 247 consular services during the 2-day consular outreach mission, including 183 new / renewal passport applications, 2 lost passport applications, 11 dual citizenship applications, 15 civil registration and 36 notarials and legalization. Atty. Pajarito also provided individual legal advice and consultation to the consular applicants.

On the night of January 19, Consul General Villa also spoke at the 43rdInduction Ball of the United Ilocano Association of Tidewater (UIAT) and inducted the association's elected officers for 2019-2020.

Michigan residents arrested for conspiracy to provide material support to ISIS

Three residents of Lansing, Michigan, were arrested without incident Monday afternoon for conspiring to provide material support to a designated foreign terrorist organization, namely the Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS). The U.S. Attorney's Office for the Western District of Michigan charged all three in a criminal complaint filed today in U.S. District Court in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The conspiracy charge is punishable by up to 20 years in federal prison.

Members of the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) arrested Muse Abdikadir Muse (Muse Muse) at the Gerald R. Ford Airport in Grand Rapids, Michigan, after checking in for a flight to the first of a series of destinations on his way to Mogadishu, Somalia. Shortly thereafter, law enforcement arrested alleged coconspirators Mohamud Abdikadir Muse (Mohamud Muse), and Mohamed Salat Haji (Haji). All three defendants are naturalized U.S. citizens who were born in Kenya. According to the complaint affidavit, Muse Muse purchased airline tickets earlier this month to travel from Grand Rapids to Mogadishu, departing on Monday, January 21, 2019. Among other support, the complaint alleged Haji and Mohamud Muse aided in the purchase of the ticket and drove Muse Muse to the Grand Rapids airport, each knowing the true purpose of the travel was for Muse Muse to join and fight for ISIS.

ASHINGTON, DC, United States of America: The Indonesian Ambassador to the United States, H.E. Budi Bowoleksono on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Indonesia granted the Cultural Award to Prof. Dr. R. William Liddle, Emeritus Professor of Political Sciences from Ohio State University and an expert on Indonesia.

The event took place at the Indonesian Embassy in Washington, D.C. and was attended by Prof. Liddle's family, his colleagues and fellow academics, the Indonesian Embassy's officials in Washington, D.C., and former US Ambassador in Jakarta, Robert O. Blake.

Two former Indonesian students under Prof. Liddle's mentorship i.e. Prof. Dr. Mohtar Mas'oed from Gadjah Mada University and Prof. Dr. Bahtiar Effendy from UIN Jakarta, were also present, along with the representatives of the Indonesian Students Association in the United States (Permias) Washington DC Chapter.

"Professor Liddle very well deserves the Award. He has spent his lifetime for outstanding works on Indonesia. Everyone, in particular those in the academic world in Indonesia knows who Professor Liddle is. His research and books are well and broadly recognized as among the best references in political sciences," said Ambassador Budi Bowoleksono in his speech appreciating Prof. Liddle's mentorship for Indonesian students and his love for Indonesian cultural products, such as rendang (caramelized beef curry) and batik.

"Cultural issues provided much of most important challenges to create and maintain modern society," Prof. Liddle explained his reason for studying culture in his political studies which concentrated on development and democratization.

Born in Pennsylvania 80 years ago, Prof. Liddle has done his research on Indonesia since the 1960s. Commenting on the Cultural Award, Prof. Liddle expressed that he was both surprised and proud because he had never expected it before.

Prof. Liddle also hailed the upcoming anniversary of the 70 years of Indonesia-United States bilateral relations by underscoring the importance of people-to-people contact to be continuously strengthened more seriously. This can be done not only by efforts to increase the number of tourists or friendship missions, but also by strengthening the Indonesian-US students' interests on the education in both countries.

The Cultural Award has been granted annually by the Indonesian Ministry of Education and Culture since the 1970s. Along with the increasing attention of the Government of Indonesia, Cultural Awards are granted to individuals/institutions including foreign individuals who extraordinarily contribute in the cultural, social, political, economic, law, scientific fields of Indonesia, and other fields that are of great benefit to Indonesia. - Embassy Of The Republic Of Indonesia

EU-US Trade Talks: European Commission presents draft negotiating mandates

The European Commission recently adopted proposals for negotiating directives for trade talks with the United States: one on conformity assessment to make it easier for companies to prove their products meet technical requirements on both sides of the Atlantic, and one on the elimination of tariffs for industrial goods.

The Member States must now give their green light to the proposals before negotiations can begin. Commissioner for Trade Cecilia Malmström said: "Today's publication of our draft negotiating directives is part of the implementation of the July Joint Statement of Presidents Juncker and Trump. Ambassador Lighthizer and I have already met several times in the Executive Working Group and I have made it very clear that the EU is committed to upholding its side of the agreement reached by the two Presidents. These two proposed negotiating directives will enable the Commission to work on removing tariffs and non-tariff barriers to transatlantic trade in industrial goods, key goals of the July Joint Statement."

As part of its commitment to transparency, the European Commission has published the drafts mandates at the same time as submitting them to the EU Member States.

The negotiating directives submitted by the Commission to the Council implement the



25 July Joint Statement and cover two potential agreements with the US.

1. A trade agreement strictly focused on the removal of tariffs on industrial goods, excluding agricultural products;

2. A second agreement, on conformity

assessment, that would help address the objective of removing non-tariff barriers, by making it easier for companies to prove their products meet technical requirements on both sides of the Atlantic.

First ever UNWTO/IPSOS Survey

Citizens recognize the positive impact of tourism

ADRID, Spain, — According to the first ever global survey conducted by the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) and IPSOS, 47% of respondents think 'they live in cities with a high number of tourists'. Over 50% considers tourism has a positive impact in generating wealth and promoting cultural exchanges, and 49% feel there should be measures to improve tourism management.

The online survey was conducted across 15 countries and targeted 12,000 people to better understand residents' perception towards city tourism, its impacts and management strategies.

"Today, adequately managing tourism to the benefit of visitors and residents alike, ensuring that local communities are listened to and benefit from tourism is more important than ever, said UNWTO Secretary-General Zurab Pololikashvili.

Nearly half of the respondents (47%) think 'they live in a city with a high number of visitors. Yet, results vary significantly across countries, ranging from 68% in Australia to only 33% in France.

The generation of wealth and income, the creation of intercultural exchanges and of new offers of leisure activities stand out as the biggest impacts on cities.

The perception of tourism's positive impacts is particularly strong in Argentina, Australia, the Republic of Korea, Spain, and Sweden.



Chinese representative meets with Abu Dhabi crown prince

n January 14, 2019 local time, Special Representative of President Xi Jinping, Member of the Political Bureau of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China (CPC) and Director of the Office of the Foreign Affairs Commission of the CPC Central Committee Yang Jiechi met with Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in Abu Dhabi.

Yang Jiechi conveyed to Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan the warm greetings from President Xi Jinping to President Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan and Crown Prince himself. Yang Jiechi expressed that President Xi Jinping paid a state visit to the UAE last year, which was of historic significance.

The main purpose of my visit this time is to implement the important consensus reached by President Xi Jinping and Crown Prince. The Chinese side is willing to make joint efforts with the UAE side to maintain the momentum of close high-level exchanges between the two countries and further



tighten the bond of China-UAE relations. Both sides enjoy smooth progress in cooperation on important projects under the framework of the joint construction of the Belt and Road Initiative. The Chinese side will work closely with the UAE side, well arrange the work of overall coordination, and make sure that relevant cooperation projects will achieve more substantial results. - Embassy of the People's Republic of China

The Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and Belgium join forces to develop the exploration and utilisation of space resources

idier Reynders, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister for Foreign Affairs and Defence of the Kingdom of Belgium, and Etienne Schneider, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Economy of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, signed a joint declaration at the Palais d'Egmont in Brussels on 23 January 2019 in which the two countries commit to collaborate on the development of an international framework for the exploration and utilisation of space resources.

Due to technological developments and the arrival of

new players, there is growing political and commercial interest in the use and exploitation of space resources.

In the initial stages, the exploitation of space resources is set to involve the moon and near-earth asteroids. These contain many resources that could be exploited, such as water, aluminium, cobalt, iron and manganese.

Water is particularly useful as it can be used directly by humans, as well as a propellant for future space missions.

Inserta's activity is part of the operational programmes of Youth Employment and Social Inclusion and Social Economy, which are being carried out by Fundación ONCE through Inserta Empleo, with co-financing from the European Social Fund, with the goal of increasing the training and employment of persons with disabilities

The event also served as an occasion to unveil a video jointly produced by the UNWTO and Fundación ONCE highlighting the contribution of persons with disabilities to the tourism sector, as well as the importance of tourism for the employment of persons with disabilities. - World Tourism Organization







Fight back against tax identity theft

It's Tax Identity Theft Awareness Week — a terrific time to get up to date on protecting yourself from identity thieves who try to claim your tax refund and imposters who pretend they're from the IRS to get your money.

Tax identity theft happens when someone uses your Social Security number (SSN) to get a tax refund or a job. You might find out it's happened when you get a letter from the IRS saying that more than one tax return was filed with your SSN, or IRS records show you earned income from an employer you don't know. Or, the IRS may reject your efiled tax return as a duplicate filing

Meanwhile, to help fight tax identity theft:

- File your return as early in the tax season as you can.
- Use a secure internet connection if you file electronically, or mail your tax return from the post office.

USCIS announces countries eligible for H-2A and H-2B Visa Programs

USCIS and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), in consultation with the Department of State (DOS), have announced



the list of countries whose nationals are eligible to participate in the H-2A and H-2B visa programs in 2019.

For 2019, Secretary of Homeland Security Kirstjen M. Nielsen and Secretary of State Mike Pompeo have agreed to:

- Add Mozambique and Samoa to the list of countries eligible to participate in the H-2A and H-2B visa programs;
 - Add Paraguay to the list of countries

eligible to participate in the H-2A visa program;

- No longer designate Ethiopia and the Philippines as eligible countries because they no longer meet the regulatory standards for the H-2A and H-2B visa programs; and
- No longer designate the Dominican Republic as an eligible country for the H-2B visa program because it no longer meets the regulatory standards for that program.

DHS maintains its authority to add countries to the eligible countries list at any time, and to remove any country at any time DHS and DOS determine that a country fails to meet the requirements for continued designation. Examples of factors that could result in the exclusion of a country or the removal of a country from the list include, but are not limited to, fraud, abuse, denial rates, overstay rates, human trafficking concerns.

Help stop the flu from spreading

More and more people are getting the flu and the American Red Cross urges everyone six months of age and older to get their flu vaccine now to be protected.

The number of people sick with the flu is on the rise, with most states (36 out of 50) reporting widespread influenza, up from 30 states earlier this month.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) reports so far between 9 and 11 million people have been sick with the flu this season, with as many as 136,000 people needing to be hospitalized.

The CDC also reported there have been more than 40,000 deaths this flu season attributed to influenza and pneumonia, including 22 pediatric deaths.

Most of the time flu activity peaks between December and February, although activity can last as late as May. You should get a flu vaccine before flu begins spreading in your community. It takes about two weeks after

vaccination for antibodies that protect against flu to develop in the body.

Flu vaccine is available now in many locations such as your doctor's office, pharmacies, grocery stores and health departments. Your vaccine will help protect you throughout the 2018-2019 flu season.

HELP STOP THE FLU FROM SPREADING

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or sleeve when coughing or sneezing, and throw the tissue away after use. If a tissue isn't available, cough or sneeze into your elbow, not your hands.
- Wash hands often, especially after coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol based hand-sanitizer.

 Avaid touching your ago, page or
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
 - Stay home if you're sick.

USCIS now accepting copies of negative P Visa consultations directly from labor unions

Effective immediately, USCIS will begin accepting copies of negative consultation letters directly from labor unions relating to a current or future P nonimmigrant visa petition. A consultation letter from a U.S. labor organization is generally required for petitions in the P visa classification, which covers athletes, artists, entertainers and their essential support personnel.

Typically, a petitioner submits the necessary P visa consultation with the petition, and that process requirement remains unchanged. After reported concerns from labor unions that some consultation letters, also known as advisory opinions, may have been falsified by petitioners and submitted to USCIS as no-objections or favorable consultations, when in fact they were negative, USCIS announced that it would begin accepting copies of negative consultation letters for 0 visa petitions. USCIS is now expanding this to P visa petitions, and labor unions are now able to send copies of negative 0 visa petition or P visa petition consultation letters directly to USCIS so that they can be compared to the consultation letter submitted by the 0 or P petitioner.

Tips from the IRS

The IRS reminds shoppers to protect their tax and financial data from identity thieves. All it takes is a few extra steps to prevent cybercriminals from stealing sensitive data, such as financial account information, Social Security numbers, and credit card information. Thieves could use this data to file a fraudulent tax return in 2019.

The IRS is partnering with state tax agencies and its partners in the Security Summit to remind to taxpayers and tax professionals about the importance of protecting data.

Cybercriminals want to turn stolen data into quick cash. They do this by draining financial accounts, charging credit cards, creating new credit accounts or even using stolen identities to file a fraudulent tax return for a refund.

Here are seven steps taxpayers can follow to help protect their accounts and their money:

 Avoid unprotected Wi-Fi. Unprotected public Wi-Fi hotspots may allow thieves to view

• Shop at familiar online retailers. Generally, sites using the "s" designation in "https" at the start of the URL are secure. User can also look for the "lock" icon in the browser's URL bar. That said, some thieves can get a security certificate, so the "s' may not always vouch for the site's legitimacy.

 Learn to recognize and avoid phishing emails. Thieves send these emails, posing as a trusted source, such as financial institution or the IRS. The criminal's goal is to entice users to open a link or attachment. The link may take users to a fake website that will steal

usernames and passwords. An attachment may download malware that tracks keystrokes.

 Keep a clean machine. This applies to computers, phones and tablets. Taxpayers should use security software to protect against malware that may steal data and viruses that may damage files.

• Use passwords that are strong, long and unique. Experts suggest a minimum of 10 characters but longer is better. Avoid using a specific word in the password. They should also use a combination of letters, numbers and special characters.

• Use multi-factor authentication when available. This means users may need a security code, usually sent as a text from a financial institution or email provider to a mobile phone. People use this code in addition to usernames and passwords.

 Encrypt and password-protect sensitive data. If keeping financial records, tax returns or any personally identifiable information on computers, this data should be encrypted and protected by a strong password.
